From 1979 designed and built up Bågen's operations from the ground upwards. Developed the theoretical and practical aspects of Consequence Pedagogy, based on conditions prevailing in Sweden, which became the fundamental social-pedagogical form of treatment used at Bagen. Bagen offered through *Stallmastargarden* an open vocational training centre for drug/alcohol abusers and others with social problems, for a total of 50 young people. The workshops were a professional restaurant, open to the public, a day-care centre for dogs (first in the world) which took care of approximately 25 dogs daily, a team of joiners, mechanics and caretakers as well as the CommIT@ments team that took care of the computers, cultural matters and were involved with other projects. *Skogsvillan* were a residential treatment home for young addicts and criminals. *PUGH* consisted of four Social Welfare Officers who process all youth matters that pass through the Social Services Department for youths between the ages of 13 and 20.
